




New Candle Stands

The Protestant Orphan Society

One of the benefits of having so many people gathered in one place for the meeting of the joint Synods is that one gets to meet the people who run charities within the Church of Ireland community. One such charity is the Protestant Orphan Society, which is managed by our own Jenny O'Regan. Meeting Jenny in her official capacity brought the opportunity to discuss how the POS has evolved to become a society that looks to the needs of not only Protestant orphans but also other young members of the Protestant community in need of financial or other assistance.

Research studies carried out over the past fifteen years reveal that destitution and poverty in young people is not so much related to being orphans but rather results from parental neglect, alcoholism, drug abuse within families and the rise of financial hardship in families where a parent struggles to meet the cost-of-living alone. The POS aims to:-

- Minimise the disadvantage that arises on the death of a parent.
- Allocate grants towards children's education from funds such as the Meath Trust.
- Offer financial assistance for children in their education years where one or both parents have died for both living and learning expenses.

This is just one charity among many very worthwhile organisations run and funded by our community. Please remember them when you decide where you might be able to make a charitable donation.
