

You may have noticed that one of the main branches on the large Ash tree growing by the wall outside the front door of the church came down during wet weather a few weeks ago. Camillus Nolan and Derek Fox kindly took care of removing it at the time.

Derek arranged an expert inspection of trees in the church grounds after which the Tree Surgeon removed the diseased tree and heavily 'pruned' another. Unfortunately many local Ash trees have contracted the fungus, *Chalara fraxinea* making some of these beautiful specimens unstable. Out of interest, if you would like to inspect the soft core of the trunk a sample may be seen in parish office.
