

In January 2017 Alison and Brian Hunt took part in a trip to Antarctica on a small expedition ship. "The purpose, as well as experiencing the beauty and wildlife of this remote part of the planet, was to explore the places made famous by Ernest Shackleton, Tom Crean and the rest of their party as they struggled to survive for almost two years on the ice without contact with the outside world. Eventually they found help after making an incredible 800 mile trip in an open lifeboat."

For three weeks Alison and Brian travelled throughout the region, landing most days by dinghy on the Antarctic Peninsula - on moving ice-sheets and on remote islands - to treck the key places involved in Shackleton's incredible story.

On Thursday, 19th October at 8.00pm in the Meeting Room they will share the story of their trip with the aid of their own dramatic photographs and videos.

This will be a fascinating presentation and all are invited to attend.

This year we commemorate the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther. As part of the Zion Parish Primary School 'Luther Project', Fifth and Sixth Class decided to run the distance between the playground and Wittenberg in the top corner North Eastern corner of Germany. Mr McDowell worked out that the distance was 1750 kilometres. And so we began.

"Over the course of a month we ran 100m laps around the playground each morning, weather permitting. There were 22 of us so multiplying 100m by 22 we ran 2.20kms per lap. Each day we completed approx. 20 laps, so 50kms per day. Today we finished this task. Well done to all the pupils who participated and completed this virtual marathon, actually it was equivalent to 45 marathons. What an amazing achievement". Sue Barber

I recently visited Myanmar, so it breaks my heart to see that hundreds of thousands of people have been forced from their homes by violence, including many Rohingya Muslims, who have fled in fear for their lives.

Over 500,000 Rohingya refugees have crossed the border into Bangladesh since late August and unknown numbers remain in Myanmar and are surviving in camps. **Christian Aid** has launched an emergency appeal to reach people in urgent need.
